

Meet the Masters: A Film Industry Masterclass and Q&A series.

Peter Spears is the Oscar-winning producer of NOMADLAND. The film from Searchlight also won Academy Awards for director Chloé Zhao and star Frances McDormand, and won the Golden Globe, Critics' Choice Award, BAFTA, PGA, Venice Golden Lion, and Independent Spirit Award for Best Picture. Spears produced Luca Guadagnino's film CALL ME BY YOUR NAME, for which he was also nominated for the Oscar in 2017. The film was written by James Ivory, who won the Academy Award for Best Adapted Screenplay. Spears also produced the MGM feature BONES AND ALL, reuniting with Guadagnino and star Timothée Chalamet, which won the Silver Lion at the Venice Film Festival. Spears's film DRIFT, directed by Anthony Chen and starring Cynthia Erivo and Alia Shawkat, premiered at the 2023 Sundance Film Festival. He worked with Guadagnino again on QUEER, starring Daniel Craig, and his most recent film, ON SWIFT HORSES with director Daniel Minahan, starring Daisy Edgar Jones, Jacob Elordi and Diego Calva premiered at TIFF last year and was released by Sony Pictures Classics around the world in April of this year. He directed the underground cult-favorite short film "Ernest and Bertram" and developed the television series "Nightmare Café" and "John from Cincinnati". As an actor, Spears has appeared in films such as "Call Me By Your Name", "Something's Gotta Give", "The Opposite of Sex", and "Father of the Bride Part II", as well as several television series, including "Friends" and "E.R." He was most recently seen in the film "Sublet", directed by Eytan Fox. In 2022, Spears founded his own production company, Cor Cordium. The company has multiple projects in development across film and television. Required for all Film students.



Born in Trento, Italy, **Andrea Pallaoro** holds an MFA in Film Directing from the California Institute of the Arts and a BA from Hampshire College. His first feature film, Medeas, starring Catalina Sandino Moreno and Brian O'Byrne, premiered at the 70th Venice Film Festival and won several awards at prestigious international film festivals including Marrakech, Tbilisi, Palm Springs, and Camerlmage. Hannah, Pallaoro's second feature film, starring Charlotte Rampling, world premiered in the Official Competition of the 74th Venice Film Festival where Ms. Rampling won the Coppa Volpi for best actress. Hannah went on to receive many prestigious international awards and recognitions including a César nomination for best foreign film. His most recent film, Monica, starring Trace Lysette, Patricia Clarkson, Adriana Barraza and Emily Browning world premiered in the Official Competition of the 79a Venice film festival and went on to win numerous international awards. Pallaoro has served on the juries of prominent world-renowned film festivals including Venice, Chicago, and Black Nights - Tallinn. He lives between Los Angeles and New York City. **Required for Film students. Open to all students.**
